This Month's Curriculum Focus: Geography

We are very excited across the Federation to have implemented, and now all be teaching using the new CUSP scheme. The high quality resources make the lessons very accessible and engaging for the children. CUSP provides a wealth of resources in the form of online books and video books, which supports a greater depth of subject knowledge.

Children are provided with knowledge organisers at the start of each topic that introduce and provide all the topic content. We are particularly finding that the CUSP scheme is challenging our children with the depth of the learning delivered, and has enhanced their whole learning experience.

The main concepts covered in Geography are Locational knowledge, Place Knowledge, Human and Physical and Geographical skills and fieldwork. CUSP provides a two-year rolling programme to ensure the knowledge and skills are taught from Early Years right through to Year 6.

This Autumn term, Key stage 1 are studying human and physical geography in the local area, which includes simple fieldwork, observational skills and the use of compasses to study the local area. They will also be comparing a small part of the UK to a non-European location -London and Nairobi.

Lower Key stage 2 will be learning all about Rivers, including the different features of a river and a study on a local river, identifying the source and the mouth.

Upper Key stage 2 are learning about the Physical processes: earthquakes, mountains and volcanoes. This includes also looking at the Earth's structure and tectonic plates.

The use of the CUSP scheme has enhanced our young Geographers learning experience and we look forward to continued success with this scheme.
