Message from the Executive Head

Dear families

You will all be aware that this year we have introduced CUSP to the teaching of many subjects in our school. I know many of you have been into school to join in a CUSP lesson and have fedback how impressed you were with the children's engagement and the aspiration of the curriculum. Mrs Moore and myself have had the absolute pleasure of monitoring it being implemented in all of our classes since the beginning of the term and witnessed a real buzz from staff and children alike. A particular highlight was last week when we met with children from all classes and asked them to share with us their thoughts about their writing lessons. We couldn't have been prouder and our only regret was we didn't film the conversations to share with you all. Here are a few snippets:

(Y5/6) "We used better vocabulary to make it more exciting. The reader would be intrigued and interested." (Y5/6) "I have improved in my knowledge of how to do my writing well. It is important to go through things again as it helps you remember."

(Y3/4) "If we don't write in paragraphs you wouldn't know which part is which. The reader won't understand when to stop reading and the next bit is going to happen."

(Y3/4) "We learnt what reported speech is and how to use it. It is instead of speech marks. You use said or told." (Y1/2) "I used adjectives to make it more exciting."

(Y1/2) "I can now write neatly on the page starting from the edge. I now need to make my letters clearer and use finger spaces."

There is certainly a sense of excitement in the air as we move closer and closer to Christmas. Staff are busy finalising plans for all the festive activities and it promises to be a wonderful time for everyone. We are particularly looking forward to opening the doors to you all and welcoming you in to join the fun.

This Month's Curriculum Focus: Art

Our CUSP Art curriculum is organised into blocks with each block covering a particular set of artistic disciplines, including drawing, painting, printmaking, textiles, 3D and collage. Each of these disciplines are revisited throughout their journey through the year groups.

Our Art curriculum outlines key aspects of artistic development through 'Working Artisticly' (explained in the table below). Each module that is taught will focus on developing different aspects of these competencies.

Shape is a flat (2D) area surrounded by an outline or edge.	Lines are used to show movement and mood.	Colour is used to convey atmosphere and mood. Within the first Art lesson of block of 3, children will revisit prior learning related to skills and knowledge learnt in their previous year. This supports the sequence of learning and the building of children's skills and knowledge as they progress through school.

New technical vocabulary is introduced within each block of lessons. Children will be encouraged to use this new vocabulary when talking about their own work or work of artists they are studying. Children are also encouraged to make links to other known words and how words relate to each other, supporting their understanding.

Our children record their Art learning in their sketchbooks. These are books where children can feel free to explore new ways of making marks, colours, shapes and lines and also where they can experiment with using old and new media, for example, pencils, charcoal, paint and print. Their sketchbooks stay with them as they move through the school years, meaning they are able to look back on previous learning and use this to support their new learning.

This term our Year 1 and 2 children are working on their drawing skills, using music to evoke mood and represent movement through mark making. They will also explore line, colour and shape, make their own painting tools and develop colour mixing skills to include secondary colours.

Year 3 and 4 will create contour drawings using still life and natural forms as stimulus. They will also learn about abstract art and develop colour mixing skills to include tertiary colours, using paint.

Year 5 and 6 children will develop their drawing skills to combine techniques to create abstract images and learn about surrealism and portraiture. They will create still life compositions by combining different media and in response to cubist work as well as adapt and refine ideas and techniques and respond to different styles of artists and art movements.
