

This month's curriculum focus:

The aim of our PSHE/RSE provision is to ensure all pupils have the knowledge and skills they need to be safe, happy and healthy in our ever evolving world.

Our PSHE curriculum at Swallowtail is organised into three concepts: Relationships, Living in the Wider World and Health and Wellbeing. For PSHE we use plans from the PSHE association to support planning sequences of learning across all key stages. A spiral curriculum has planned to allow pupils to revisit knowledge linked to the three concepts. Explicit teaching of vocabulary is a key feature of teaching at the Swallowtail Federation. Each unit introduces children to key vocabulary, which is then built on as they revisit the three concepts. For RSE we use the RSE solutions scheme to support planning sequences of learning across all key stages. From April 2021 it became statutory that all primary age children (Reception to Year 6) are taught RSHE. These subjects are designed to equip your child with knowledge to make informed decisions about their well-being, health and relationships as well as preparing them for successful adult life. The world for all young people looks very different from the way it did 20 years ago when this curriculum was last updated – these changes bring the content into the 21st century, so that it is relevant for your child. All units can be found on our website. Please see below a couple of examples of our RSE planning. The RSE curriculum begins in Reception and progresses all the way to year 6.

Our children record their PSHE/RSE work in class floor books and this can be viewed at our shared work sessions after school. *Dawn Steers—RSE and PSHE subject leader*.
