This month's curriculum focus: Design and Technology

The aim of our CUSP DT curriculum is to ensure that pupils are equipped to successfully think, work and communicate like a designer. Our curriculum is ambitious and focuses on excellence in this subject through a range of disciplines and by referencing outstanding practitioners in this field. The intention is that the pupils are inspired and acquire knowledge as designers and technologists and enables them to skilfully apply their understanding.

Our CUSP Design and Technology curriculum at Swallowtail is organised into blocks with each block covering a particular set of disciplines, including: food and nutrition mechanisms, structures, systems, electrical systems, understanding materials and textiles. Vertical progression in each discipline has been deliberately woven into the curriculum so that pupils revisit key disciplines throughout their Primary journey at increasing degrees of chal-

Central to the learning modules are activities designed to develop pupils' oracy and vocabulary skills to enable them to use the language associated with design and technology meaningfully when talking about their work and the work of others.

In addition to the core knowledge required to be successful within each discipline, the curriculum outlines key aspects of development in the Working as a Designer section. Each module will focus on promoting different aspects of these competencies.

The CUSP Design and Technology curriculum delivers an expertly written and ambitious curriculum that the pupils within our Swallowtail Federation thoroughly enjoy.
